

The town spans 104 square miles and includes the villages of Florida, Greenwood Lake, and Warwick, and five hamlets, Amity, Bellvale, Edenville, New Milford, and Pine Island. It borders the "arts & crafts village" of Sugar Loaf to the north, and Vernon, NJ to the south.

Historically an agricultural area, farming still plays a significant role in the community. Warwick's apple orchards are a particular point of pride, and the town hosts its annual Warwick Valley Applefest every October. The celebration of the local harvest attracts thousands. The town offers a wealth of farm markets, antique centers, wineries, and local bespoke maker shops.

Warwick's natural beauty extends across rich farmland, rolling mountains, creeks and lakes, all intertwined with scenic country roads. Outdoor life includes hiking, golfing, skiing, boating, fishing, cycling, and much more. Warwick's black dirt region, which spans Pine Island and Florida, produces 25 percent of the nation's onion crop, along with organic vegetables, sod, and flower crops.
