BUDGET:

Shall the Board of Education of the Warwick Valley Central School District be authorized to expend \$109,140,179 the sum of money required for school purposes for the July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024 school year (the Budget), and to levy the necessary tax therefor on the taxable property of the School District?

SCHOOL BUSES:

Shall the Board of Education of the Warwick Valley Central School District be authorized to: (a) acquire five (5) school buses and incidental equipment at a maximum aggregate cost of \$830,000; (b) expend such sums for such purpose; (c) expend from the Capital Bus Reserve an amount not to exceed \$330,000 for such purpose; (d) levy the necessary tax therefor, to be levied and collected in such amounts as may be determined by the Board of Education taking into account state aid received and amounts disbursed from the capital reserve fund; and (e) in anticipation of the collection of such tax, to issue bonds and notes of the District at one time or from time to time in the principal amount not to exceed \$500,000, and to levy a tax to pay the interest on such obligations when due?



GRADES 3-8 ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS RESULTS (2021-22)




TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATION RESULTS

The "year" used to identify the cohort is the year in which the July 1 - December 31 dates fall. Results are reported four years after these students first enter grade 9.

Due to COVID-19 and changes to New York State testing requirements, Regents examinations in June 2020 through January 2022 were canceled, with the exception of the June 2021 Regents Examinations in ELA, Algebra I, Living Environment, and Physical Setting/Earth Science.
